

CUYAHOGA HEIGHTS VILLAGE SERVICES

ANIMAL CONTROL: The Village provides an animal warden to control unwanted stray animals in your yard, free of charge.

BASEBALL PERMITS: The Village operates two baseball fields at Bacci Park. A permit and a \$25.00 deposit are required for use of all fields and are available only through the Village Hall. Residents and companies located in the Village of Cuyahoga Heights may use the ball fields. The pavilions at the ball fields are included with the permits and are available to “residents only” on the weekends.

BUS TRIPS: The Village bus operates one to two times per week for Village residents, free of charge. Schedules are distributed with the Village Newsletter. Reservations are required and are obtained by calling the Village Hall at 641-7020 before 8:30 a.m. on the morning of the trip. Pick-ups and drop-offs are made at the resident’s home.

CHARITY PICK UP: The Village Service Department will pick up from your residence any usable item that you would like to donate to charity on the first Wednesday of each month. Household items, furniture, clothes, etc., are collected and given to area shelters and charity programs. No tax receipts are given for this service. You must call the Village Hall prior to the first Wednesday of the month for this service.

CHRISTMAS PROGRAM: Resident children, ages 0-12 years, who register with the Village Hall, are eligible to receive a Christmas stocking or a gift certificate from Santa Claus who delivers these items to each home on the Sunday before Christmas. Information is sent to the residents in the Village Newsletter.

CLINIC: The Village operates a well visit clinic with a registered nurse. Residents (*60 years and older*) are eligible for certain blood work and an EKG at no charge once a year. The Clinic is located in the Village Hall and is open by appointment only from March through October. Please call JoAnn Socausky, R.N. at (216) 520-0927.

COMMUNITY HOUSING MAINTENANCE GRANT PROGRAM: The program assists and encourages homeowners in the Village to make repairs to the exterior of their homes which will enhance property values. Homeowners can receive up to a maximum of \$2,000 in a five year period; however, not more than \$1,000 per year.

DUMPSTERS: Residents may rent a Village dumpster for personal use at their home by paying \$30.00 to the Village Clerk for each dumpster load. Use of the dumpster is for demolition only. Examples of demolition are: lumber, railroad ties, windows, doors, roofing material, flooring (*not carpeting*), drywall or plaster, stones, rocks, bricks, concrete, cement blocks, etc.

FLU SHOTS: Flu shots for seniors over 60 years of age are paid for by the Village and provided once a year by the Cuyahoga County Board of Health. The program is held during the fall in the auditorium at the Village Hall.

GARBAGE PICK UP - RECYCLING - YARD WASTE: The Village Service Department collects garbage every Monday at no charge to its residents. Simply take your garbage, recycling, and/or yard waste cans to the curb by 8:00 a.m. on Monday morning.

GRASS CUTTING: The Village will cut the grass of each senior citizen's residence that is 60 years of age or older and that qualifies under the program.

HEALTH WATCH PROGRAM: Cuyahoga Heights sponsors a Health Watch Program through the Fire Department for senior citizens who are 60 years of age or older. The program co-pays for an alarm that is worn around the neck of the resident to activate in case of an emergency.

KLIMA GARDENS: Klima Gardens is available to rent for private parties and picnics by Village residents beginning in January of each year. A refundable deposit of \$200 is required for booking the pavilion. Non-residents are charged a \$500 fee to rent the facility, in addition to the \$200 deposit.

LEAF PICK UP: During the autumn months, the Village will vacuum and dispose of residents' leaves, which residents rake to their curb.

MEMORIAL RESOLUTIONS & FLOWERS: A party tray or monetary gift will be sent to the family of deceased residents from the other Village residents and a memorial resolution from the Mayor's office. A police escort is also provided for the funeral procession of our deceased residents. In addition, if the deceased resident is a war veteran, their name is etched into our veteran's memorial in front of the Village Hall.

NEWSLETTERS: In order to keep our residents informed, the Village publishes and delivers a newsletter to the residents on a quarterly basis. In addition, minutes from council and workshop meetings are posted to the Village's web site at www.cuyahogaheights.com.

NOTARY SERVICE: Lee Ann from the Village Hall is a Notary for the State of Ohio, Cuyahoga County, and would be happy to notarize anything that you require, free of charge during regular business hours.

PARKS AND PLAYGROUNDS: The Village owns, operates, and maintains Bacci Park with a pond for fishing in the summer and ice-skating in the winter. Bacci Park also has its own playground, two ball fields, three pavilions, and a soccer field.

PERMITS: Permits for ATV's and Bow Hunting season can be obtained at the Police Department. These permits are for resident's only, and can only be issued by the Police Chief or his designee. You are required to show proper identification when obtaining your permit. Also, you must be 18 years of age to obtain an ATV permit without parent/guardian signature.

PROPERTY TAX REBATE: While fiscally sound, the Village may issue a \$575.00 property tax rebate to each homeowner who legally owns a home on May 1st of each year. Council votes on this rebate each year.

RECREATIONAL OUTINGS: The Village of Cuyahoga Heights sponsors many groups who offer recreational outings for our residents at a very, reduced rate. The Community Activity Committee and the Senior Citizens Club provide trips and parties to provide entertainment and fun for our adults and children.

ROTOTILLING: The Cuyahoga Heights Service Department will rototill residential gardens once a year, free of charge, upon request.

SAFETY SERVICES: Cuyahoga Heights Police and Fire Departments provide full-time safety protection to our residents and industries with free ambulance service for our bona fide residents to the hospital of their choice.

SEWERS: The Village of Cuyahoga Heights pays the sewer bill for each residential dwelling in the Village.

SMOKE ALARMS: Cuyahoga Heights Village will provide a smoke alarm to each residence of the Village and will physically replace the batteries annually during National Fire Prevention week in October, free of charge. Call the Fire Department at 641-6799 for more information.

SNOW REMOVAL: The Village will plow the driveway of each senior citizen's residence that is 60 years of age or older and qualifies under the program after 2-inches or more of snow has fallen, and after the streets are plowed free of charge. Each homeowner and/or resident must have a waiver of liability on file at the Mayor's office for this service.

SPECIAL PICK UPS: Special pick ups for large items such as appliances, furniture, mattresses, large trash items, etc., are every Tuesday, free of charge. The resident must call the Village Hall at 641-7020 prior to Tuesday for this service.

SPORTS PROGRAMS: Cuyahoga Heights Village provides a means for both our children and adults to participate in Village or area sport programs. Participation in baseball, basketball, soccer, football, and swim teams are all free of charge.

SWIMMING POOL: Cuyahoga Heights Village owns and operates an outdoor swimming pool, wading pool, and splash fountain during the summer months for Village residents only, as well as Cuyahoga Heights School District residents.

TABLE & CHAIR RENTAL: A limited number of tables and chairs are available for use by residents having parties *at their residence*, free of charge. Please contact the Service Department to arrange a time when you can pick them up.

VILLAGE HALL RENTAL: The Village Hall Auditorium (*upstairs*) and the Ralph E. Contipelli Civic Center (*downstairs*) are available for use by Cuyahoga Heights Village residents only, twice in each calendar year, A refundable deposit of \$100 is required for booking either facility.

YARD WASTE DISPOSAL: The Service Department will pick up any yard waste on Mondays. Have your yard waste at the curb or clearly marked at your trash can area.
