The owner has walked away from the home, and we have an agreement with her to pay off the house for what is owed.

**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASE OF PROPERTY LOCATED AT
5037 EAST 71ST STREET IN THE VILLAGE**

WHEREAS, this Board has determined the purchase of real property located at 5037 East 71st Street in the Village of Cuyahoga Heights, which is subject to pending foreclosure proceedings, will deter blight, promote the general stability of the surrounding area, and will advance the economic well-being of the Village at-large and would be in the best interest of the Village, its residents and businesses, and the greater Northeast Ohio region.

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Board of Trustees of the Cuyahoga Heights Community Improvement Corporation:

Section 1. The President of the Board is hereby authorized to negotiate for the purchase of the property located at 5037 East 71st Street, Cuyahoga Heights, and to enter into a purchase agreement for the Property with a purchase price not to exceed \$37,500.00 and with terms approved by the Village of Cuyahoga Heights Law Director.

Section 2. That this Resolution upon passage and approval shall become immediately effective.

Mr. Bacci agreed to make the motion, seconded by Mr. Bloam, to authorize the purchase of 5037 E. 71st Street in an amount not to exceed \$37,500.00 in accordance with the above stated provisions.

WHEREFORE, there is no more business to be presented to the Cuyahoga Heights Community Improvement Corporation, Mr. Greenberg agreed to make the motion, seconded by Ms. Duszynski to adjourn the Corporation's meeting, and move into the regular Council Meeting.

MAYOR AND COUNCIL REPORTS:

The Mayor stated that he needs Public Works to walk the Pool and Klima Grove. Nothing earth shattering, they will survive another year, but as we move forward with what we want to do with the Grove, Scotty has some things he wants to bring forward to Public Works, that we are either going to need to tidy up, and this falls under economic development as well. If we are going to do anything with that corner in the very near future then we don't do anything. If we're not going to do anything to that corner and there are no economic development opportunities, then we need to paint the ceiling, refresh the lighting, and do some concrete work as well.

Public Works at the pool, the pool is starting to show its age, we are getting some things tidied up still moving into the open season here, but we do have a boiler that went down. This boiler is backed up by another boiler, but we can't risk having no heat to the pool. We have people paying a good price to attend our pool, and it has to function like a business and done properly, so Scotty is getting prices from contractors to fix it.

Ms. Duszynski asked if we counted on doing this work this year. The Mayor said no. He said he wanted Public Works to look at them because they are looking not up to the standards of a Cuyahoga Heights facility.

The Police test is July 26th, the Dispatch test is Saturday June 21st, and we are going to have two full time openings. Ms. Christine Suhy is retiring, and Ms. Brandy Murphy is going to be staying home with her new baby and working for us in a part time capacity, giving up her full time position.

Our Fire exam which is nothing more than a technicality per our Ordinance will be held Saturday June 14th. The 11 candidates that signed up for the test have been made aware that we have 7 members of our bargaining unit whose jobs are preserved for them if they wish to return through attrition. So they know if they score number 1 they will be number 8 on the list. Our Lieutenant test will be given June 28th to replace Mark and Brian's Lieutenants positions on the road. And with your approval, I need the appointments of Kevin Stack, and Jamie Edward Lucas for new hires in the Police Department.

There was a discussion concerning mutual aid between all of the communities. It was mentioned that each of the neighboring communities uses part time firemen and policemen from many different communities, and they are all very professional.

Ms. Harris agreed to make the motion to adjourn the Council Meeting, Ms. Duszynski agreed to second.

MAYOR AND COUNCIL REPORTS:

MAYOR BACCI:

It was brought to our attention that Mr. Pejanovic passed away. Our condolences go out to the Pejanovic family. Our thoughts and prayers are with them.

Congratulations to the Cuyahoga Heights High School Lady Redskins softball team. They are the Division IV State Champions. The Mayor prepared a proclamation recognizing their achievement. The Mayor contacted the school to see what we could do to recognize the team, and it is always hard doing something in the summer when the students are out and working during vacation. Mr. Contipelli suggested putting up a sign on the street like other communities with some sort of dedication.

Memorial Day was a very well attended event. We tried to get our young people to understand that this is not a game, and that Memorial Day is about the ones that have passed on protecting our Country, and how we honor them. The Mayor thanked all who attended and participated.

The Clerk, I, as well as other Council members attended the State of the School address at the Holiday Inn. Mr. Superintendent, Mr. Bergant spoke at length about how they are trying to make the schools safer, and the measures that they are taking. They did a great job.

We had the third graders walk through the Town Hall. All of the Senior Staff was there to address the student's questions. It was well received and we had lots of good questions for everyone.

The Village Garage sale will be Saturday June 28th starting at 8:00am and going through to 3:00pm.

MS. HENLEY:

Ms. Henley asked Scotty if there was some way they could make a devise to help hold up the door to the dumpster where we scrap our paper and cardboard. It is very hard to hold it up when inserting the paper and it comes down on your head. The Mayor suggested that Ms. Henley follow up with Gateway Recycling that supplies the dumpster to see if there is anything they can do, and we will get Scotty to try to find a solution.

She stated that the Mayor and the Town Hall personnel did a great job of organizing the Memorial Day services.

She mentioned the garage sale, and asked the Mayor if there could be a charity pick up after 3:00 for anyone that wants to donate all of the items unsold. The Mayor said that would be fine, but he is not going to do it for only one or two people. He asked Ms. Henley to get a list of residents that will commit to this and we will see what we can do.

MR. BLOAM:

He wanted to let Council know that there will be legislation coming through for some of the projects that Public Works and the Engineer Todd Sciano went over in April. And he called another Public Works meeting for June 19th at 10:00 am at the Town Hall to go over the Pool and Klima Gardens to look at some of the issues.

MR. CONTIPELLI:

Congratulations to the girl's softball team for being the first Cuyahoga Heights team State Champions. Also congratulations to the boy's baseball team who made it to the Regional finals.

Next year they will also be in contention, they have a Village resident, Michael Hartman is a great pitcher for the team. He will be a junior next year.

Memorial Day went very well, it was nice weather and he was glad to see many of the residents in attendance.

As far as the Mill Creek Watershed program, they are looking to have a designation by the end of the year. We have 40 members from ten different communities, and what they are starting to do is set up a steering committee which leads to a board of directors. They have asked me to be a part of this committee to represent Cuyahoga Heights. Once they have a designation they can go after money from the government. They are asking anyone to donate their time to this cause to get certified.

MS. DUSZYNSKI:

Our Workshop on the five year plan went well. There was a lot of hard work done by our Clerk and the members of the Finance Committee.

Ms. Duszynski asked the Mayor if he would consider getting another dumpster. A lot of people are now fixing their houses, and it seems as though they are well used. The Mayor stated that he has Scotty looking into it and he will get us prices.

MS. HARRIS:

Ms. Harris thought it was great that the Police and Fire Department escorted the girl's softball team out of the school and to the freeway. It was a very nice touch.

Ms. Harris asked the Mayor if we are going to get a new traffic signal by the school when we stripe the streets. She said it is very confusing having two lights. The Engineer Todd Sciano said that it looks like March of 2015 before the signals will go in. The Mayor and Mr. Sciano will review the plans.

CHIEF STURGILL:

He wanted to thank Council for the approval of the two new patrolmen. It was a very long search for the right candidates. They are both from the Cuyahoga Heights area which is very nice. At the passage of the academy they will be sworn in around December of this year or January of next year.

HEAD DISPATCHER CASH:

Ms. Christine Suhy will be retiring after 30 years of dispatching, and we all wish her best wishes in her retirement.

SERVICE DIRECTOR SCOTT WALDEMARSON:

He is looking at getting prices to outfit the concession stand at Bacci Park. We are working on the south island on E. 71st Street. There will be electricity, seven trees, and sod. Frank Domzalski at the Service Department believes we can plant sod and keep it ok throughout the year from the street salt. He thinks we can bring it back in the spring by over seeding it in his opinion.

FIRE CHIEF CASH:

The firefighters will be out flushing hydrants next week.

LAW DIRECTOR JON GREENBERG:

He wanted to let everyone know that we sold the note this week at a very good 1% interest rate.

COMMENTS FROM THE AUDIENCE:

MR. JOHN TRAFFIS:

Mr. John Traffis asked what service department vehicle we are giving to another community. The Mayor explained that we are giving Garfield Heights the 1994 dump truck. As good neighbors, we are going to donate it to them.

He asked if none of our part time officers wanted the full time positions being taken by the new hires. The Mayor said that by law we have to give an exam, so we could not just plug in a part timer. Most of the part time candidates could not take the test because they were over the maximum age.

Mr. Traffis stated that the new street cameras that are taking pictures of speeders looks like a money grab, and he feels that we are above that. The Mayor stated that there is no cost to the Village. Mr. Traffis believes in our Policeman giving tickets, not cameras. To me that is blackmail.

Councilwoman Harris believes that the cameras have slowed down traffic on E. 71st Street.

He is happy we brought in the Firefighters Credit Union, it is a beautiful building, and he just wished it didn't cut into Klima Grove. The Mayor stated that the footprint for the building was necessary because of the issues with the property in the rear.

Mr. Traffis stated that he heard we hired a part time worker for the service department, and he is from Brooklyn Heights. He asked if we had no kids in Cuyahoga Heights, because he knows Bryan Jones from Willowbrook is one we should have considered. He feels if we are going to hire part timers for the Service Department, we start with our kids first. The Mayor said point taken.

MS. CINDY KRENISKY:

Ms. Krenisky asked the Mayor about the property that we are looking to purchase. She wants to know what we are going to do with it. The Mayor said we are looking to raise the house, but if we could get someone to build a new house there, we would certainly look at that. He feels we would have to get two properties together in order to build new. The Mayor stated that it is a long legal process before we get this property. We are also looking at the other homes in foreclosure in the Village. It is a long hard process. For house on E. 71st Street, we would like to get it to put a walking path to Bacci Park instead of having to go all the way down the hill on Canal Road.

Ms. Krenisky asked if we could keep the doggy bag dispensers full so people could get bags to pick up after their animals. The Mayor said he will take care of it.

WHEREFORE, there is no further business before this Council, Ms. Duszynski moved, seconded by Mr. Contipelli that the Council Meeting be adjourned at 7:55 PM. All voting aye, none opposed: motion carried.
