Service Department:

FRIENDLY REMINDER:

All trash must be placed in garbage bags prior to disposing of in the Village issued trash cans. <u>In addition, dog litter must be bagged before placing in the trash can.</u>
Your cooperation is appreciated.



Recycle Your Computer: The Cuyahoga Heights Service Department will pick up your unwanted equipment. All you need to do is call the Village Hall at 641-7020 by Monday to be put on the special pick up list for Tuesday. Acceptable home computer equipment includes CPU's, monitors, keyboards, mice, printers, terminals, modems, cables, software, and ink printer cartridges. Cell phones and their accessories are also accepted.

Tree Trimming: Each residential property is able to receive one (1) tree removal and up to two (2) trims per calendar year. Each property owner must sign a "Waiver of Liability & Right of Entry" form before having this service. Applications for this program are available at the Village Hall during normal business hours, or you may download the application from our web site under the "Service Department."

Tree Lawns: Tree lawns in the Village will **not** be cut by our Service Department personnel, except for those tree lawns for the seniors/disabled residents that qualify with the grass cutting program. As always, we thank you for your continued cooperation.

Rototilling: The Service Department will begin rototilling residential gardens during May (weather permitting.) Garden areas must be marked clearly. Please call the Village Hall during normal business hours to schedule this service.

Table and Chair Rental: Residents are still able to rent tables and chairs as long as you are able to pick up and drop them off from our service garage. The maximum number of tables and chairs you can rent are: 3 tables and 30 chairs. In addition, the tables and chairs must be used at the resident's home, and are **not** to be taken out of the Village. Please contact the Service Department at 641-3035 to make arrangements to reserve tables/chairs. If no one is available to take the call, please leave a message on their answering machine.



Police Department:



The Cuyahoga Heights Police Department participated in the annual Greater Cleveland Peace Officers Memorial Society Parade on Friday, May 15th. The parade was from E. 12th and Lakeside to E. 3rd. Following the parade there was a memorial service held in Police Memorial Square (Huntington Park) for fallen officers.



Park Rules (Section 1076 Village Ordinance)

Please remember that residents need to stop by the Police Department for a fishing permit in order to fish at Bacci Park. Also, there is no boating permitted in the pond at Bacci Park. All ball diamonds and pavilions need a permit for use. Please contact the Village Hall for those permits. And lastly, please remember that your dogs need to be on a leash in the park — just like when walking your dog on the sidewalks of the Village (618.01 Village Ordinance).

Reminders

Unregistered motorized bicycles/scooters, ATV's (446.01 Village Ordinance), and golf carts (450.01 Village Ordinance) are not permitted to be on Village sidewalks or roads. You can find all of the Ordinances on our web site at www.cuyahogaheights.com.

Now that school is approaching summer break and more kids will be out during evening hours, curfew hours will be enforced in an effort to keep our kids safe (648.10 Village Ordinance). Parents, please reference the following schedule:

- 12 years of age and under 9:00 pm to 6:00 am of the following day
- 13 and 14 years of age 10:00 pm to 6:00 am of the following day
- 15 and 16 years of age 11:00 pm to 6:00 am of the following day
- 17 years of age -12:00 midnight to 6:00 am

Also, please remember if the kids are in your yard and it is past their curfew time, an adult needs to be present outside with them. Thank you and have a safe summer!

Dispatch:

Just a reminder to all of our residents, if you are going on vacation you can call dispatch at 883-6800 to put a special attention on your home. We are going to ask you when you will be leaving and when you will be returning home, if you have stopped your mail and paper, if you are going to leave any lights on in your home, if anyone will be stopping at your home during your absence and an emergency telephone number in case there is a problem. Dispatch will then forward that information to the Police Officers so they can check your residence throughout the day and night.



Fire Department:



CPR Training at CHHS

The Cuyahoga Heights Fire Department trained the Cuyahoga Heights High School 10th grade class in the American Heart Association Emergency Cardiovascular Care Programs as follows: Heartsaver Adult CPR/AED, Child CPR/AED, and Infant CPR. The students were given a curriculum that included classroom and hands on training. The students also completed a written and hands on test. We are proud to say that all the students passed!

Fire Hydrants Flushed

The Cuyahoga Heights Fire Department will be flushing hydrants over the next few weeks. Notification signs will be displayed on the end of the streets the day before the hydrants are flushed. If your water becomes discolored, please run it to clear before using.



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S.E.R.T. Haz-Mat Training at ASK Chemicals

The Cuyahoga Heights Fire Department, Southwest Emergency Response Team (S.E.R.T.) Hazardous Material Team and ASK Chemicals teamed up to do a mock chemical spill drill last month. The drill simulated a chemical spill in the loading dock of ASK Chemicals and the Cuyahoga Heights Fire Department served as the first-in-squad/engine and command. The S.E.R.T. team and the Cuyahoga Heights Fire Department trained on the use of gas monitoring, unified command and the S.E.R.T. team practiced plugging of containers and drains to prevent the chemical spill from spreading.



Service Department (continued):

Grass Cutting Reminder!

660.15 WEEDS AND GRASSES

- (a) Every owner, occupant or person in control of any lot or land within the Municipality shall cause to be cut and destroyed all Russian, Canadian or common thistle, wild lettuce, wild mustard, wild parsley, ragweed, ironweed and all other noxious weeds growing or being upon such lot or land and shall cut any other weeds or grasses to a height not to exceed six inches within two days of the receipt of notice as hereinafter provided. The Service Director shall issue notice to the owner, occupant or person in control of any lot or land within the Municipality, upon which any of the aforementioned noxious weeds, or grasses or other weeds in excess of six inches, are growing or standing, to cut and/or destroy the weeds and/or grasses within two days. The notice may be served by delivering it by one or more of the following procedures: personally delivering it to the owner, occupant or person in control of the land; delivering it or mailing it by regular or certified mail at the usual place of business or residence of the owner, occupant or person in control of the land; posting it in a conspicuous place on the land involved. A separate offense shall be deemed to have occurred each day on which such weeds or grasses are allowed to stand longer than two days after the receipt of such notice.
- (b) Weeds or grasses which are not removed or cut as required by division (a) hereof are declared to be nuisances. The Service Director shall cause the abatement of the nuisance and shall report the cost thereof to Council which may assess the same on the real estate on which the nuisance existed. Such remedy shall be in addition to the penalty provided in division (c) hereof.
- (c) Whoever violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor of the fourth degree and shall be subject to the penalty provided in Section <u>698.02</u>.
