

From the Clerk:

The Village pool was a huge success this year and summer is coming to an end too soon. We are into our eighth month of the year and our finances are looking solid. There have been no major financial concerns so far this year. Our General Fund is at \$1.4 million, and we are looking to end the year with over a million dollars in the bank after all of our bills are paid.

Although a million dollars in the bank is comfortable, we need to start looking at future costs and future projects. I am currently doing our five year projection, and all costs are rising. Our medical alone went up 5% this year, and when we pay a million dollars a year for medical that is a \$50,000.00 increase. Five percent raises every year for five years is an extra \$250,000.00.

Although we are in good shape financially this year, in the near future, we will need to look at increasing our revenue to continue to keep up with inflation. If you have any questions or concerns, my door is always open.

Village Hall:



General Election

Exercise your right to vote in the upcoming General Election on Tuesday, November 3, 2015. In addition to county wide issues, our Village Council Members are all up for re-election. Do your part as a citizen and vote. The polls will be open downstairs in the civic center at the Cuyahoga Heights Village Hall from 6:30 a.m. until 7:30 p.m.



If you are a new resident and haven't yet changed your address with the Board of Elections, forms are available at the Village Hall during normal business hours. In addition, we also have "Vote by Mail Ballot Applications."

Voters must be registered in Cuyahoga County in order to vote in any election. In order to vote in Cuyahoga County, you must meet the following requirements:

- You must be a United States Citizen;
- You must be at least 18 years old on the day of the General Election;
- You must be a resident of Ohio for at least 30 days;
- You must register to vote at least 30 days before an election to be eligible to vote.
- 17 year old residents can register and vote in a Primary Election if they will be 18 on or before the General Election. 17-year-olds can vote for candidates only.

Voter Identification Requirements:

Voters must bring identification to the polls in order to verify identity. Identification may include:

- A current and valid photo identification card (e.g., driver's license or state ID)
- A military identification
- A copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other government document that shows the voter's name and current address.

Note: You cannot use as proof of identification a notice that the board of elections mailed to you. Voters who do not provide one of these documents will still be able to vote by provisional ballot. Voters who do not have any of the above forms of identification, including a social security number, will still be able to vote by signing an affirmation swearing to the voter's identity under penalty of election falsification and by casting a provisional ballot.

It is that time of year again when students will be returning to school. The first day of classes for the Cuyahoga Heights School District is Thursday, August 20, 2015. Please keep these helpful tips in mind. Together with your cooperation we can ensure that our young ones have a safe school year

Motorists:

- Please obey the reduced School Zone Speed limit of 20 MPH.
- Stay alert and watch for children as you back out of your driveways and when crossing sidewalks.
- Stop at least 10 feet from all stopped school buses receiving and discharging students.
- Please obey all traffic direction from Police and School Crossing Guards as they supersede any traffic signal.
- Please observe all parking regulations when dropping off and picking up students.
- Remember to stop at the stop line, if you stop beyond it you could be on the crosswalk.



Parents and Students:

- Please cross the street at designated pedestrian crosswalks and avoid stepping from between parked vehicles/school buses.
- Be alert to vehicles exiting from driveways and parking lots.
- Stay on the sidewalks and lighted areas while walking both to and from school.
- Avoid horseplay while adjacent to streets and roadways.
- Please escort younger walking students to the crossing area.
- Be alert to any suspicious persons and/or vehicles that may be along the route to campus and contact the Police ASAP!

Flu Shots

In cooperation with CVS Pharmacy and the Mayor's Office, the Village of Cuyahoga Heights will be offering flu shots to our Village senior residents (60 years of age and older). Just like we have done in the past, the Village will pay for flu shots for our Village senior residents and employees. In addition, we will offer flu shots to our Village residents who are under 60 years of age; however, those individuals are required to pay for their flu shot at a cost of \$25.00; payment of "exact" cash or check is due the day of the shot.



The flu shots will be administered on Friday, October 2, 2015 in the auditorium of the Village Hall from 9:00-10:30 a.m. As in past practice, **flu shots will be offered by reservation only**. Please call Lee Ann at the Village Hall at 641-7020, Monday through Friday during normal business hours to make your reservation. Also, please advise if you need a ride to and from the event. Deadline to register is 12:00 p.m. on Thursday, September 17.

Our well visit clinic will also be open that morning for our senior citizens beginning at 8:30 a.m. with our Village Nurse, Joanne Socausky – no reservation is required. If you plan on getting blood work, please do not eat or drink anything after midnight the night before. We will have a light breakfast, as well as refreshments for our senior resident participants.
