Flu shots

In cooperation with Independence Discount Drug Mart and my office, we will be offering flu shots to our Village senior residents (60 years of age and older). If you are 65 years of age or older, please bring your Medicare Card as we will seek Medicare payment for qualifying seniors. Just like we have done in the past, our Village will pay for flu shots for our Village senior residents and employees. In addition, we will offer flu shots to our Village residents who are under 60 years of age; however, those individuals are required to pay for their flu shot at a cost of \$32.00; payment of "exact" cash or check is due the day of the shot.

The flu shots will be administered on Friday, September 28 in the Village Hall Auditorium between the hours of 9:00-10:00 As in past practice, flu shots will be offered by reservation only. Please call Lee Ann at the Village Hall at 641-7020, Monday through Friday during normal business hours to make your reservation. Also, please advise her if you need a ride to and from the event. Deadline to register is Wednesday, September 12.

Our well visit clinic will also be open that morning for our senior citizens beginning at 8:30 a.m. with our Village Nurse, Joanne Socausky - no reservation is required. If you plan on getting blood work, please do not eat or drink anything after midnight the night before. We will have a light breakfast, as well as refreshments, for our senior resident participants.



Pest Control Program

Pest control services are available by calling Rich or Jeremy Kozlovich at Pest Management, Inc., at (216) 661-3553. Please leave a message with your name, address and nature of problem. This service is free except for termites, bed bugs, and wildlife. In addition, they will also spray the outside of your home in the spring to hinder any unwanted pests from entering your home.

Bus Trips

Our Village bus operates one to two times per week for our Village residents, free of charge; schedules are distributed with the Village newsletter. Reservations are required and obtained by calling the Village Hall at (216) 641-7020 before 8:30 a.m. on the morning of the trip. For a Saturday, trip, please call the Village Hall before 3:30 p.m. on Friday. All trips leave approximately at 9:00 a.m. unless otherwise noted. In addition, pick ups and drop offs are made at the resident's home. Please note that there is a \$5.00 non-resident fee.

East 49th Street Parking Lot

As many of you may know, in an effort to assist our East 49th Street residents that require additional parking from time to time for visitors, parties, etc., you are able to use the new parking lot on the west side of the street. Please note that use of the parking lot will be by permit only; just as we do when a resident needs to rent Klima Gardens, the Village Hall, Bacci Park pavilions, and so forth. To secure your permit, please stop at the Village Hall during normal business hours, Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m. and 1:00-4:30 p.m. No deposit fee is required.

From the Building Department

George M. Suhy Grant Program

To all homeowners in the Village looking to enhance their property value with exterior and limited interior repairs, don't forget about the George M. Suhy Grant Program. The program is designed to help assist and encourage residents in the Village to maintain and beautify their homes which will enhance property values throughout the Village. Homeowners can receive up to \$3,000 in a five year period (2018-2022) or use three grants in one year for three separate projects totaling \$3,000. The max dollar amount you can receive for one grant is \$1,000.

Please be sure to follow the correct procedure when applying for the grant program. The paperwork consists of a Part One (pre-inspection) and Part Two (final inspection) form. You can get forms online at www.cuyahogaheights.com or stop by the Building Department at the Village Hall.

Please be sure to have your contractor register with the Building Department and fill out the permit application. Please contact the Building Department with any questions at (216) 641-7020 and speak with Norm Casini or Ken LaBella.

From the Service Department

Tree Trimming/Removal Service

The Village will provide a professional tree trimmer to remove or trim a tree on a resident's property. Please note that tree trimming/removal is limited to two (2) trims per year and one (1) removal. If a crane is needed for tree removal, it is the responsibility of the homeowner to pay for the service. In addition, if a stump needs ground, it is the responsibility of the homeowner to pay for this service, whether the homeowner uses the tree company that the Village has a contract with or another tree company. Forms are available on our website and at the Village Hall during normal business hours.

Table & Chair Rental

A limited number of tables and chairs (maximum of 3 tables, 30 chairs) are available for use by residents having parties at their residence, free of charge. Please contact the Service Department at (216) 641-3505 to arrange a time when you can pick them up during normal business hours.

Dumpsters

Residents may rent a Village dumpster for personal use at their home by paying \$30.00 to the Village for each dumpster load. Use of the dumpster is for demolition only. Examples of demolition are: lumber, railroad ties, windows, doors, roofing material, flooring (not carpeting), drywall or plaster, stones, rocks, bricks, concrete, cement blocks, etc.

Garbage Pick Up - Recycling - Yard Waste

The Village Service Department collects garbage every Monday morning beginning at 8:00 a.m. at no charge to its residents. Our Service Department will come into your yard and take your garbage tote and recycling container to the curb; afterwards they will carry it back into your yard. Please not that if a holiday falls on a Monday; the service will commence on Tuesday.

From the Sports Commissioner

Summer is in full swing and we have had many new teams renting the softball and hardball fields this year. It's great to see the fields being used so much. If you know anyone interested in renting the fields, please have them reach out. We'd be happy to welcome them!

We had 14 children register for fall soccer and are working with the villages of Valley View and Brooklyn Heights to place them on teams. Coaches should be reaching out to parents in the next several weeks to begin scheduling practices. We also had 5 children sign up for flag football and 3 for cheerleading.

Unfortunately, there wasn't enough interest for either an adult men's or women's softball team this year. Valley View and Brooklyn Heights are working to place residents on teams, but since full rosters are submitted to the villages, there is no guarantee that our residents will be placed on teams. We should know more soon.
