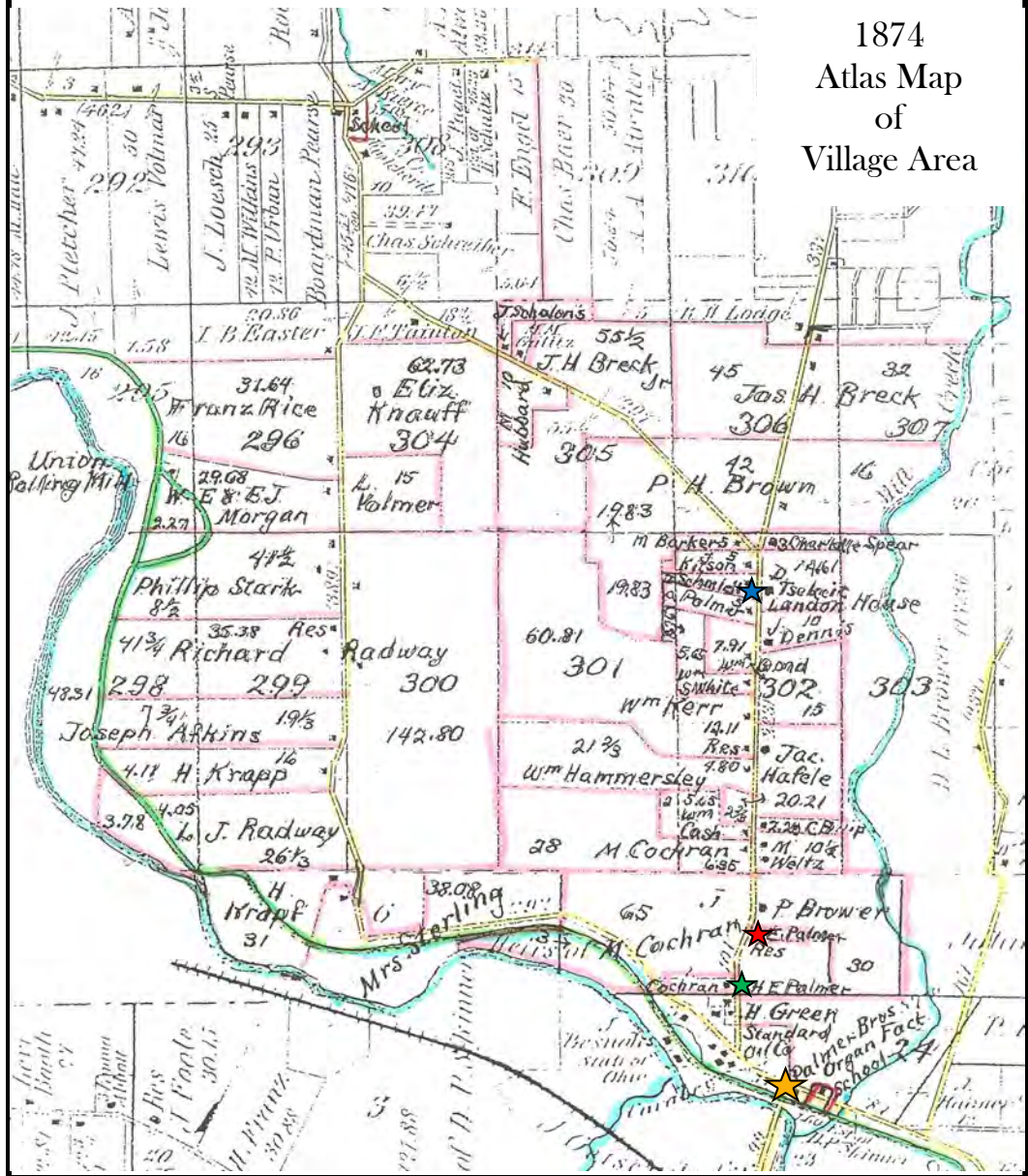

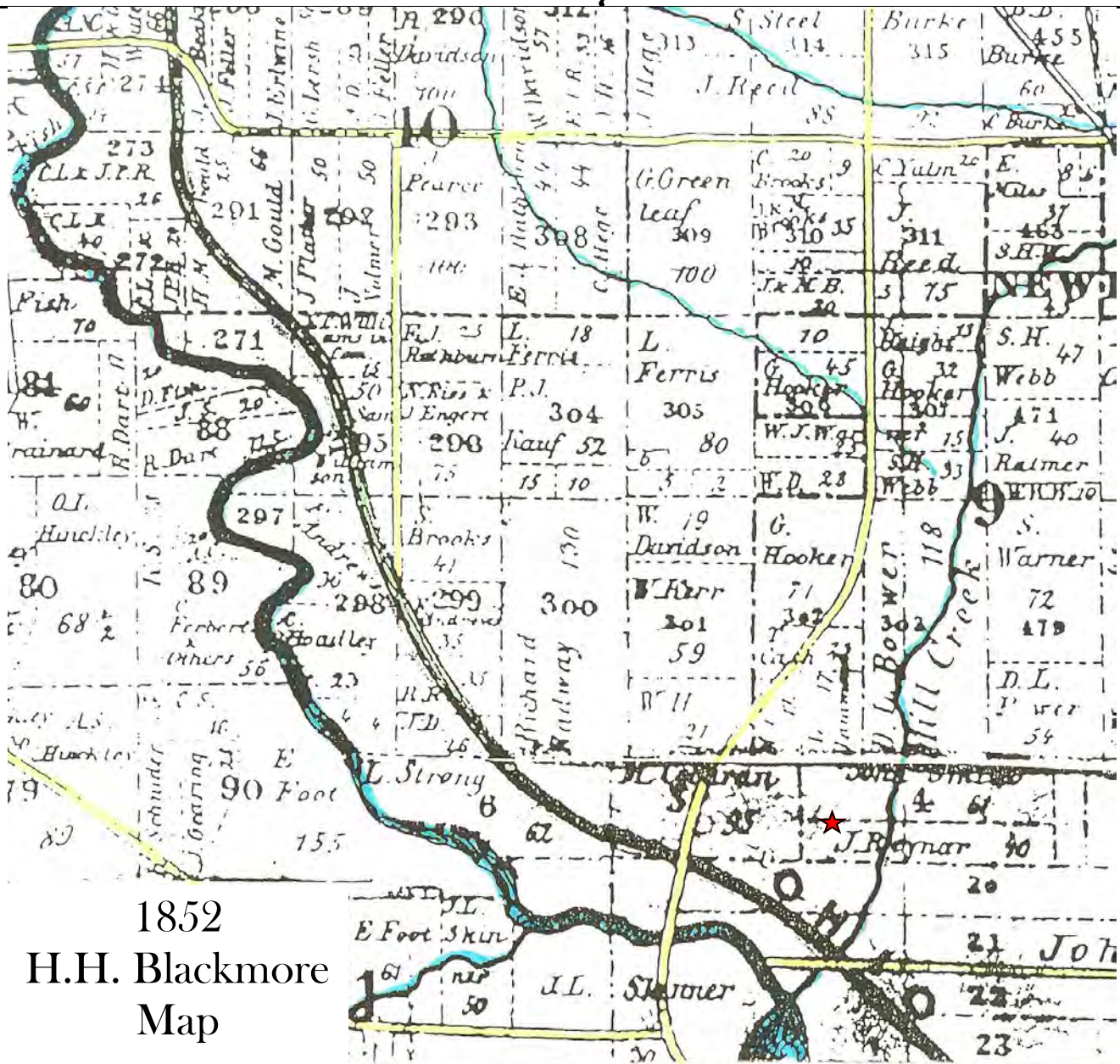

This issue is about Charles H. & Lois Lucinda Chase Palmer's Victorian style home on E 71st Street. It was probably built in 1876 right after they bought the land from Perry Brower. The red star is their house; Green star is the area Charles' brothers Chancy, Michael & nephew Henry Palmer lived at different times; Orange star is where the Palmer Brothers Organ Factory was by the canal; Blue star is O. Palmer's home. We have found no connection between him & the Palmer brothers.

Palmer House Land Owners

1852 the land was owned by John Raymer [Raimer].

Perry Brower bought land before 1860.

Charles & Lois Chase Palmer were living there in 1860

Perry Brower sold 1 acre to Lois Palmer on August 29th 1876; the loan was paid off on July 28 1881 & deed filed August 15, 1881

Charles Palmer died in 1899; Lois Palmer died in 1913

At sometime Erwin & Inez Becker who owned a real estate company & Reliance Investment Company took control of the property

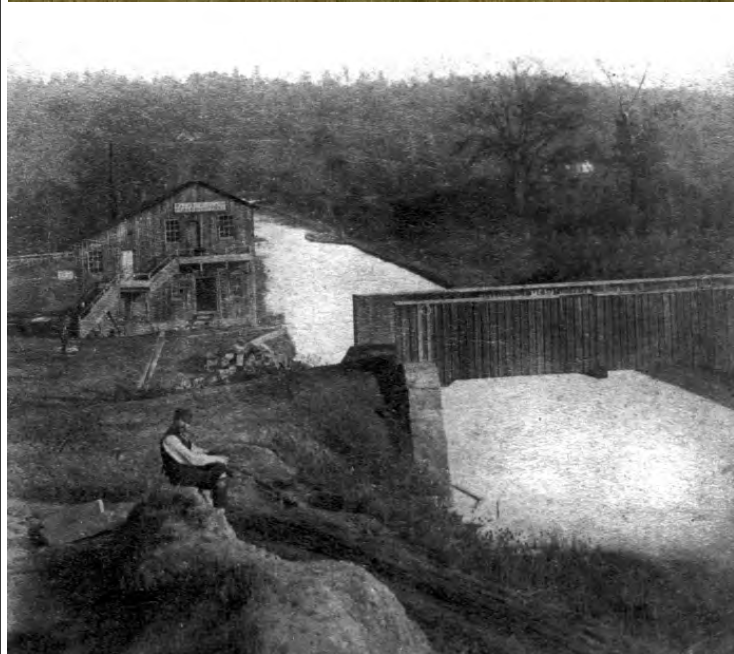
Erwin & Inez Becker sold the property to Joseph & Nettie Carruozzo on June 7, 1922

Nettie Carruozzo died in 1960.

Joseph died in 1962 leaving the land to his daughters Marie Carroll & Angela Sheaffer

Marie & Angela sold the property to Ronald & Antoinette Eliason September 30, 1966

Antoinette "Sue" Eliason now owns the house.

The 1870 Census

Charles Palmer was a Melodeon
maker & Michael Palmer was a
Melodeon tuner. Charles Palmer’s
house & the organ factory were both
in Independence Township. It was
still known as part of old Newburgh
& now our village.

The 1870 business census
for Independence township shows
Palmer Brothers Melodeon & Organ
Factory had 2 workers;
all work was done by hand;
they made 25 cabinets organs valued
at \$3,480; paid \$300 in wages;
bought \$1,000 in supplies.
