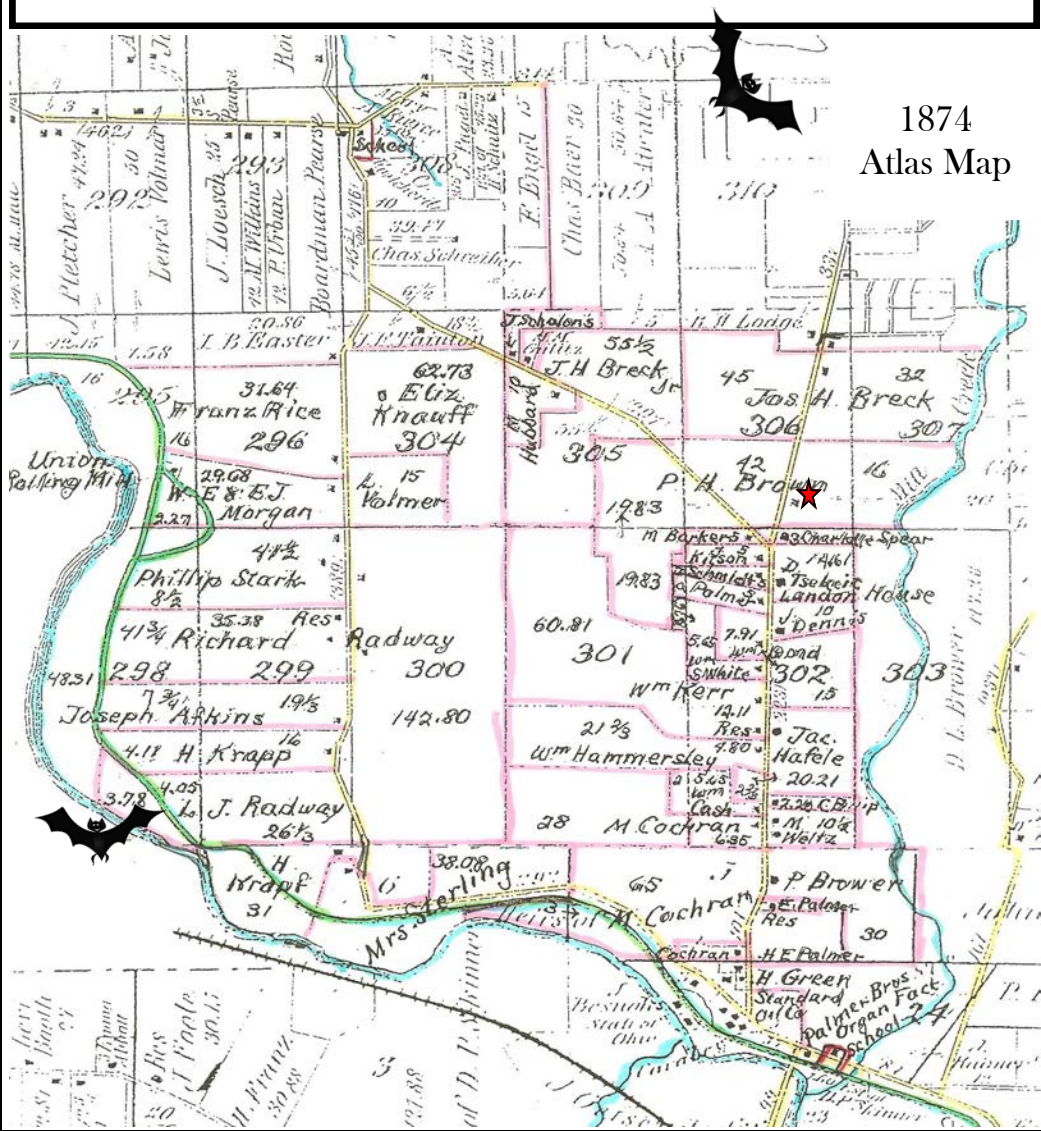


## Committee News

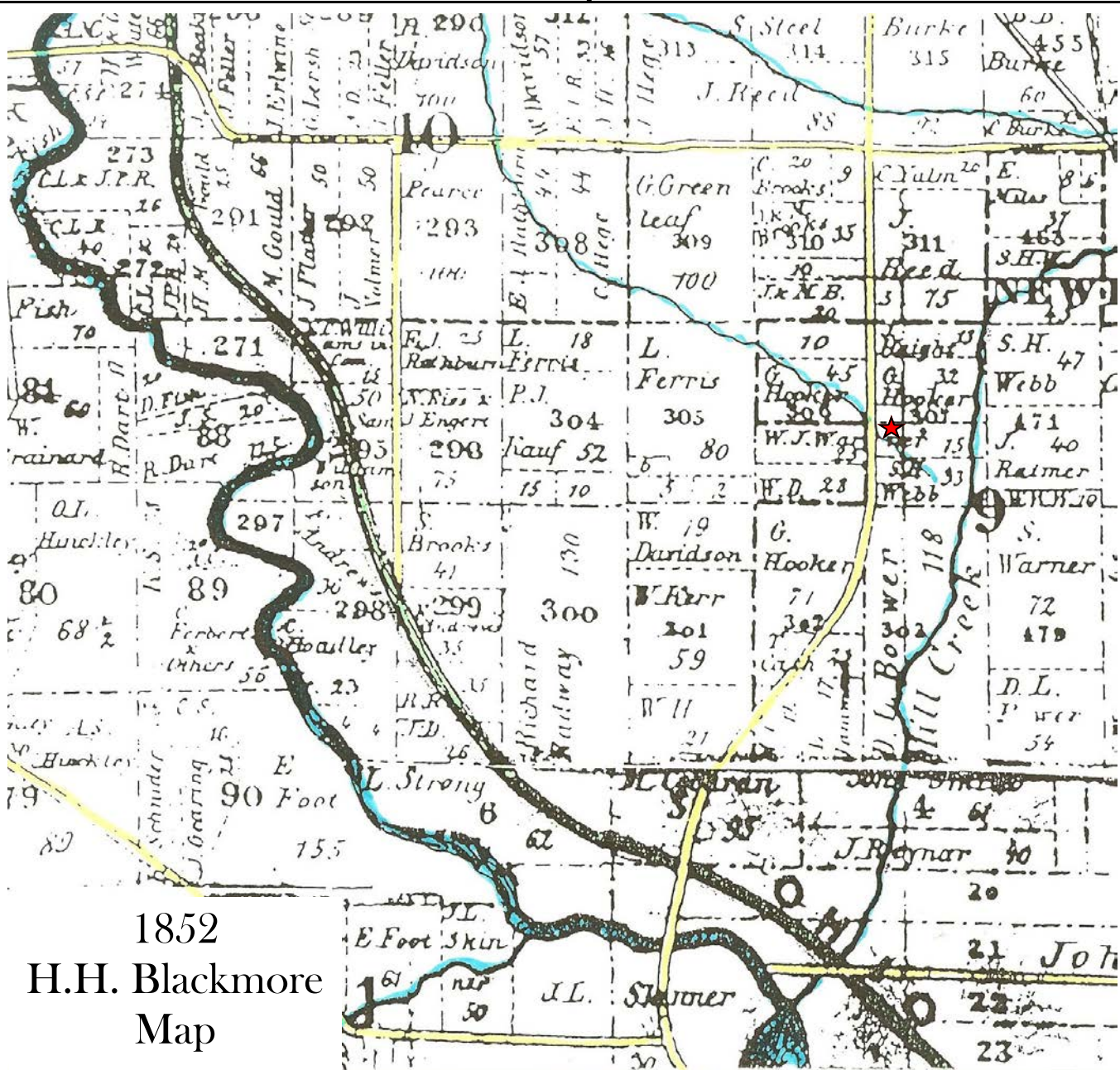
Anyone interested in doing the Willow House Times next year please let Sandy know. This might be a project for a high school student for their school community service.

## Village



### Newburgh Heights & Cuyahoga Heights Village Hall - Owners

1834 - David Clark owned the land & had died. His daughter Margaret Clark Norton sold the land to William Rogers; 1836 - William & Harriet Rogers sell to Gustavus Foster; 1838 - Gustavus & Jerusha Foster sell to Wareham Warner; 1853 - Wareham Warner sells to Maria Jane Davidson [daughter of William Davidson] 1893 - Maria J. Davidson Willet of Chicago, IL. sells to Peter Brown; 1905 - Peter H. & Mary J. Brown sell to the village of Newburgh Heights for their village hall; 1918 Cuyahoga Heights seceded from Newburgh & the village hall was within Cuyahoga Heights. A court battle gave the land to Cuyahoga Heights; 1932 - Cuyahoga Heights receives deed for village hall.; 1939 -Village sold land to Casimiro Pallini; Casimiro & Domenica Pallini sold to their son John P. Pallini; 2002 - John Pallini died & his sons David, Donald & Douglas receive the land; 2015 - David, Donald, Douglas Pallini & Elizabeth Yarmesch sell to the Cuyahoga Heights Community Improvement Corporation; 2016 the old town hall building is demolished to make room for a future business.

## **Do You Know?**

### **Columbus Day**

A national holiday in many countries in the Americas and elsewhere which officially celebrates the anniversary of Christopher Columbus arrival in the Americas on October 12, 1492. The landing is celebrated as "Columbus Day" in the United States, as "Día de la Raza" ("Day of the Race") in many countries in Latin America and as "Día de la Hispanidad" and "Fiesta Nacional" in Spain, where it is also the religious festivity of la Virgen del Pilar. It is also celebrated as Día de las Américas (Day of the Americas) in Belize and Uruguay, as Discovery Day in the Bahamas, as Día del Respeto a la Diversidad Cultural (Day of Respect for Cultural Diversity) in Argentina and as Giornata Nazionale di Cristoforo Colombo or Festa Nazionale di Cristoforo Colombo in Italy and in the Little Italys around the world.<sup>[1][2]</sup> These holidays have been celebrated unofficially since the late 18th century and officially in various countries since the early 20th century.
