Mr. Contipelli asked if we were again paying down the debt, and what is our interest rate. Ms. Meriwether said that we will be paying down our debt by \$200,000.00 again this year, and the interest will be around the same as last year at 1.85%.

Ms. Biro asked our legal team if we need a municipal advisor since the bank and the bond council are not advisers. Mr. Unger said that our banker advises us in the sale of the note and whether we note or bond it, but not giving us guidance on our overall financial position. Mr. Mason will get in touch with the bond council and see what he thinks. Ms. Meriwether said that if the note gets to the point that it is in our best interest to bond the debt, she will get an adviser.

Since this project involves a property owned by the Mayor, Mayor Bacci left the chamber.

Ms. Harris asked Mr. Sciano to give Council a quick rundown of the project.

In June, we will have both houses down and move into the next phase of the project. Once the demolition is complete, we can begin filling the property to shore it up, and then leveling it off for the trail. Mr. Bloam asked how long this would take. Mr. Sciano said it will take a year to finish this portion of the trail.

Mr. Bloam asked if the entrance to dump the fill will come from the bottom or top. Mr. Sciano said it will have to come from E. 71st Street. Until we have made enough room for the trucks to drive in, dump, and turn around, there will be a lot of backing in at that site.

Mr. Contipelli asked Mr. Sciano if he could have a letter sent to the residents that this project is moving forward, and there might be some inconvenience on E. 71st Street in this area. Mr. Chojnacki said he will get together with Ms. Harris to get something out to the residents. Mr. Sciano believes that there will be 30-40 trucks delivering fill daily. Ms. Biro said that they will produce a lot of dust, and asked Mr. Sciano what we can do to help the problem. Mr. Sciano said that we will monitor the situation and be smart about it. He has contacted the Police Chief, Fire Chief, and Service Director to help work through any problems. We will take our time, and do it right.

Mr. Contipelli asked if we are just incorporating the language changed by the State into our Tax Ordinance. Mr. Chojnacki explained that we are adding the language from the Ohio General Assembly on how payers submit and pay their local net profit. This only affects anyone paying net profit.

Motion authorizing the CFO to enter into a contract with Fabrizi Trucking & Paving Company for annual Catch Basin Repairs, Sewer Repairs, and Pavement Repairs not to exceed \$25,000.00.

Mr. Bloam said that this is a Public Works recommendation with Mr. Sciano to get these repairs done in a timely fashion.

Ms. Biro said that CFO Meriwether called her as the head of Finance to approve this purchase, but at the request of the Finance Committee, we wanted to bring this to the full Council for a vote.

Motion for Engineer Sciano to advertise for bids on the "Nicky Boulevard Storm Sewer Extension and Slope Stabilization Improvements."

Ms. Biro asked Mr. Sciano what phase of the project are we in. Mr. Sciano and Mayor Bacci said that we are in the first phase.
