IN HOME RECYCLING

Aluminum Cups Empty and rinse. No straws.



Cups (Plastic) Empty and rinse. No straws. Discard lids.

Cans Empty and rinse.



Glass Bottles and Jars Empty and rinse.



Cardboard Empty and flatten.



Paper and Boxes Empty and flatten boxes.

Plastic Bottles and Jugs & Tubs Empty and rinse.



Leave These Out of Your Recycling

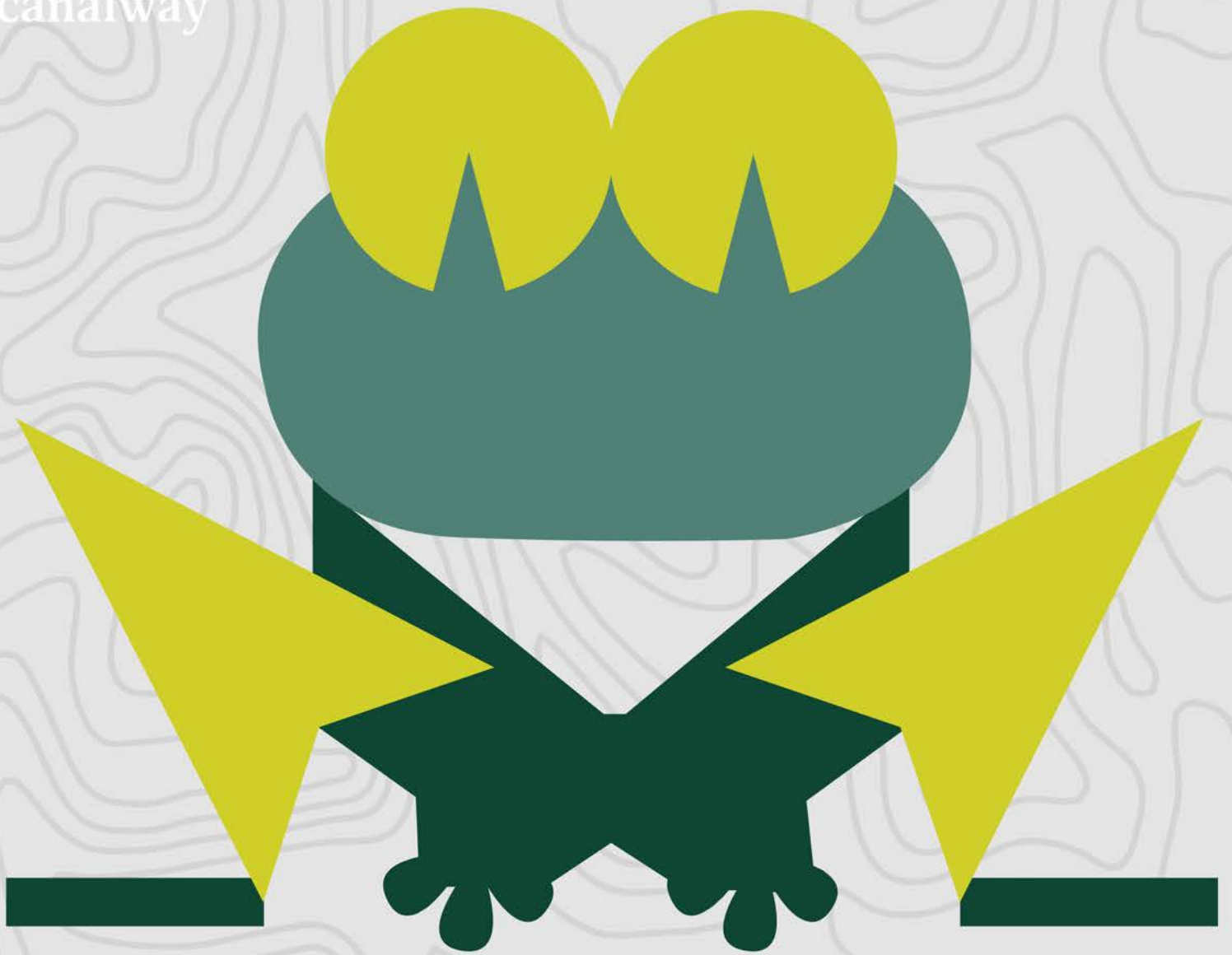

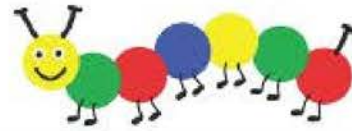

Important Election Information

Partisan Primary Election

- This is a partisan primary election in which voters must select 1 of 3 ballot types to vote.
- Voters **MUST** choose either an **Issues Only**, **Republican**, or **Democratic** ballot.
 - A party ballot **ONLY** contains candidates from the Democratic or Republican party along with any issues available to the voter.
 - An Issues Only ballot contains issues but does **not** include any candidate names.

- ✓ An Ohio Interim ID form issued by the Bureau of Motor Vehicles
- ✓ A U.S. passport or passport card
- ✓ A U.S. Military ID card, Ohio National Guard ID card, or U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs ID card (that includes the voter's name and photograph)

A Message from the Cuyahoga Heights Schools

Schools are on a fixed income, too!

In 1976, the legislature enacted property tax reform known as House Bill 920. Its purpose was to keep inflation from increasing voted taxes. This is how it works:

Most of a community's tax millage is made up of taxes voted on by residents when they approve individual tax levies. When the voters approve a tax levy, each property owner pays their share in proportion to the value of their property. In general, the higher the value of the property, the higher the taxes.

When property values increase due to inflation (a reappraisal or update), House Bill 920 kicks in. Suppose a school district receives voter approval to raise \$3 million through a 5 mill levy and the following year, after a triennial update, property values have increased. House Bill 920 does not allow the school district to receive any additional money from the voted levy based on the increased property values. Instead, the voted 5 mills will be reduced to a millage amount that will generate \$3 million based on the increased property values, and each taxpayer will pay a lower "effective" property tax rate. Thus, in order for the school district to raise more revenue to meet ever increasing costs, it must ask voters to approve another levy.

At CHS, the last levy was approved by district voters in March 2012. Today, that same levy continues to generate roughly the same dollars that voters approved in 2012 even though inflation and district operating expenses have increased during this period. Thus, CHS's primary revenue source has been relatively fixed for many years.

And this is why there is a levy on the March 19th primary ballot.
