
From Mayor Bacci's Desk

An important issue for March is the Primary Election which will be held on Tuesday, March 19. One of the crucial items on the ballot is a proposed tax levy from the Cuyahoga Heights Local School District. For those that don't know, CHS Superintendent Tom Evans will be leading tours of the school buildings and grounds on Saturday, February 24 at 9:00 a.m. and Sunday, March 3 at 12:00 p.m. No appointment is necessary and everyone is welcome to join; please meet at the school pillars. During the tour, Mr. Evans will highlight some of the maintenance areas that have been discussed with the permanent improvement monies on the upcoming ballot. Earlier this month at our February 14 council meeting, village council passed a resolution in support of the levy. We hope that our residents will do their part and vote on March 19.
